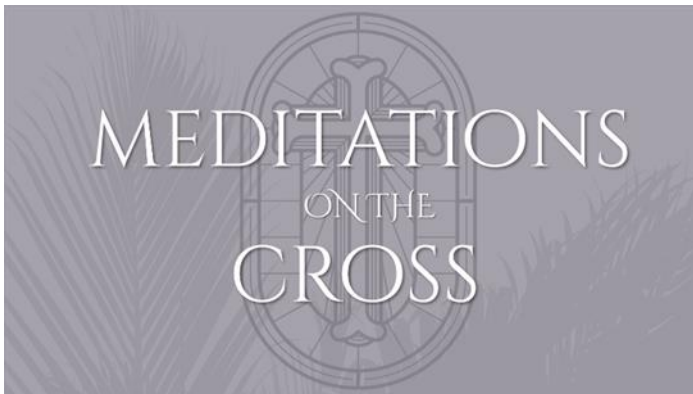


HOLY WEEK AT CHELTEN



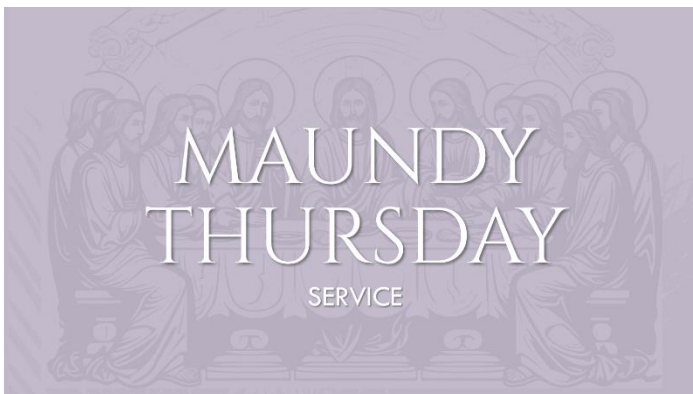
Palm Sunday Worship | April 13, 9:00 & 11:00 a.m.

9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m.

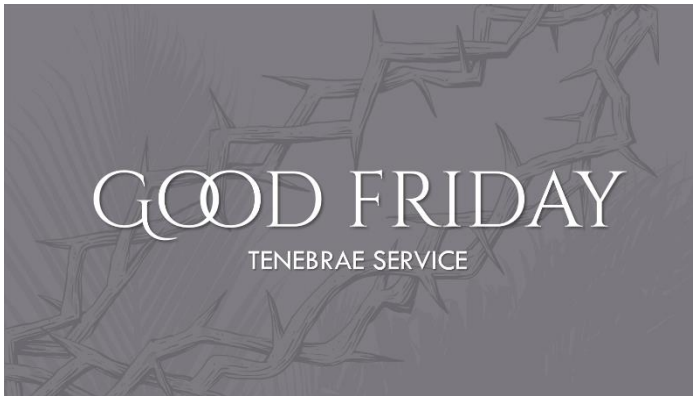

Maundy Thursday Service | April 17, 7:00 p.m.

On this meaningful evening, we journey through the events leading to Jesus' crucifixion, remembering how he loved his disciples to the very end. Through Scripture, song, and communion, we'll reflect on his sacrifice, humility, and unwavering love, even in the midst of his darkest hour.

This service calls us to pause, reflect, and prepare our hearts for Good Friday. Ultimately, we look ahead to Easter when his power is fully revealed. Come as you are; all are welcome.



Good Friday Tenebrae Service | April 18, 7:00 p.m.

The service of Tenebrae, meaning “darkness,” has been practiced throughout history, becoming an important part of worship during Holy Week. The purpose of this service is to reflect deeply on the sufferings and death of Christ for us and our salvation. Tenebrae is marked by meditation on Christ’s suffering.

Christ's suffering is commemorated through the reading of scripture. Candles are extinguished one by one as we

listen to the account of Christ's suffering and death. After the last verse is read, the last candle is put out, and the room is plunged into darkness.

The Tenebrae service reminds us of the sobering reality of our sins and the depth of Christ's love that covered our sin at the cross of Jesus Christ.



Easter Sunday Worship | April 20, 9:00 & 11:00 a.m.

On Easter morning we stand in awe of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. We celebrate the power of God that conquered death and raised Jesus from the dead!

We invite you to immerse yourself in the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. We pray that the magnitude of God's love, sacrifice, and power will move and shape us in the likeness of Christ as we worship together this week.
